- an area of extensive older terraced housing and mobile population
- 1 FE, 207 pupils, PPG 57%, SEND 25% EAL 36%
- Victorian building on several floors and a restricted site

The Forest Academy




- Forest on the Kendray estate a mix of council and private housing
- 1.5 FE, 306 pupils, PPG 47% SEND 16%
 EAL 17%
- Post-war buildings on a very large site, lots of trees, hence name

Oakhill Primary Academy




- Oakhill on Doncaster Road just beyond the Stairfoot roundabout
- serving the Ardsley community of largely private housing
- 1.5 FE, 287 pupils, PPG 16% SEND 15% EAL 6%





DLD Day - Raising Awareness



On the 16th Detaber 2020 Oakhill pupils came to school wearing purple or yellow to show support for Develomental Language Disorder
(DLD) day. We had a silent playtime where the children could only use sign language or a whiteboard to communicate.

What is DLD!

DLD sauses difficulties with speaking and understanding for no known reason. There are serious and long-term impacts, as it suits children at greater risk of falling at school and struggling with martal health and future employment. The siggest challenge with DLD is you cannot sall by looking at a present that they have DLD and therefore, they often get overlooked for support.

Three things you should know about DLD...

- Developmental Language Disorder is when a shild or adult has difficulties talking and/or understanding language
 DLD is a hidden disability that affects approximately two children in every clearance, affecting literacy, learning, frindships and amelional wall-leving.
